



THE INFLUENCE OF PODCASTS ON MODERN SPOKEN ENGLISH

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Abstract: In recent years, podcasts have become one of the most influential forms of digital communication worldwide. Their growing popularity has significantly affected the development of modern spoken English, particularly in the areas of vocabulary, pronunciation, conversational strategies, and informal communication patterns. The present study investigates the influence of podcasts on contemporary spoken English and examines the linguistic transformations associated with podcast discourse. source of language transformation and deserve detailed linguistic investigation (Myers, 2010).

The aim of this research is **to analyze the influence of podcasts on modern spoken English.**

- filler words;
- pronunciation patterns;
- grammatical simplification;
- audience-oriented communication.



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The analysis focused on **recurring linguistic tendencies** that demonstrate the influence of podcasts on contemporary spoken English. The methodological approach of the research is additionally influenced by studies on conversation and technology in digital communication environments presented by Hutchby (2001).

Results

Another important finding is the increasing use of **filler words and discourse markers** in modern spoken English under the influence of podcasts. Common expressions include:

- “like”;
- “you know”;
- “I mean”;
- “actually”;
- “well.”

These elements help speakers organize spontaneous speech, maintain fluency, and establish **emotional connection with listeners** (McCarthy, 1991).

The study also demonstrated that podcasts encourage **grammatical simplification** in spoken English. Speakers frequently use:

- incomplete sentences;
- ellipsis;
- fragmented utterances;
- repetitions;
- simplified syntactic structures.

For example:

“*Sounds good.*”

“*Never really thought about it.*”

“*Pretty interesting actually.*”

Such constructions imitate **natural spontaneous communication** and contribute to **conversational authenticity** (Gee, 2014).

Another significant influence of podcasts is connected with **pronunciation and intonation patterns**. Podcast hosts often use relaxed pronunciation, connected speech, reduction, emotional intonation, and expressive stress patterns. As a result, listeners become increasingly familiar with **natural spoken English rather than formal textbook pronunciation**.



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The findings additionally revealed that podcasts promote **audience-oriented communication**. Podcast hosts constantly attempt to involve listeners through direct address, rhetorical questions, humor, storytelling, and emotional interaction. Expressions such as:

“Have you ever experienced this?”

“Let me know what you think.”

“You probably understand this situation.”

create the impression of **personal communication** and strengthen listener engagement. This interactive communicative model reflects the characteristics of **modern digital environments** described by Androutsopoulos (2014).

The analysis also showed that podcasts contribute to **the globalization of conversational English** because listeners from different countries adopt modern spoken expressions, discourse markers, and communication styles frequently used in podcast discourse (Jones, 2015).

Discussion

The findings of the study confirm that podcasts have become **an influential factor in the transformation of modern spoken English**. Their conversational nature encourages the spread of **informal communication patterns and emotionally expressive speech behavior**.

One possible explanation for this influence is the communicative structure of podcast discourse itself. Consequently, podcast hosts intentionally use conversational language in order to sound natural and relatable (Fairclough, 1995).

The active use of filler words, slang expressions, and simplified grammar demonstrates that modern spoken English increasingly values **communicative efficiency and emotional authenticity** over strict grammatical formality (Tagg, 2015).

The research also suggests that podcasts influence not only vocabulary but also communicative behavior. Many listeners unconsciously adopt pronunciation patterns, conversational markers, intonation models, and speech habits commonly heard in podcasts. This process reflects **broader tendencies characteristic of modern digital communication environments** (Myers, 2010).

Another important observation is that podcasts accelerate **the international spread of contemporary spoken English**. Since podcasts are accessible worldwide, they contribute to the globalization of English-language communication and the dissemination of modern conversational norms (Thornbury & Slade, 2006).

The interactive nature of podcast communication additionally reflects **the technological transformation of conversational practices in digital environments**. Modern podcasts combine traditional spoken interaction with technologically mediated communication, which changes the dynamics of language use and audience participation (Hutchby, 2001).

The results of the study contribute to the further development of Digital Linguistics, Pragmatics, and Media Linguistics.

Future research may investigate the influence of podcasts on English language learners, generational differences in podcast communication, and cross-cultural aspects of podcast



discourse.
